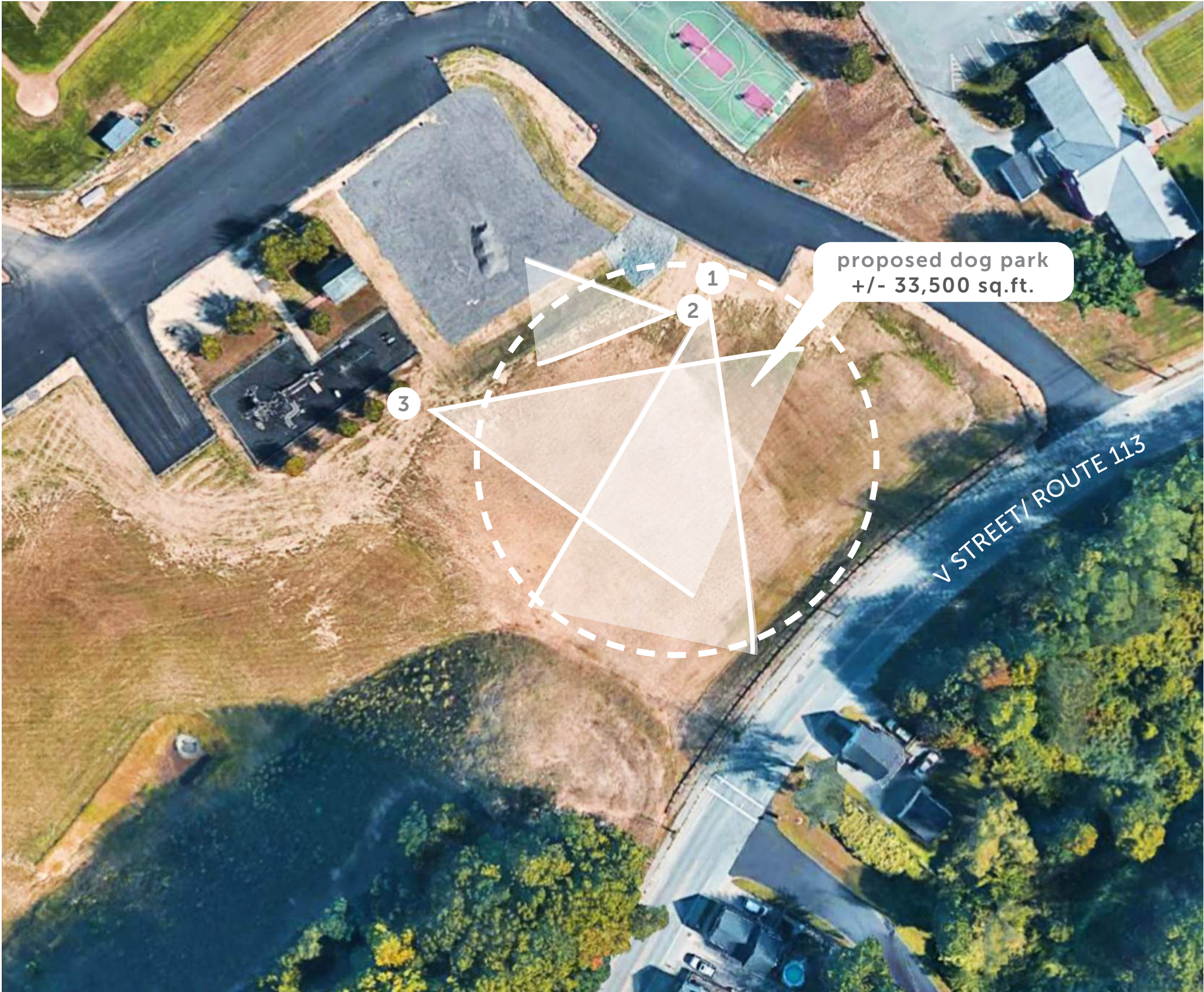

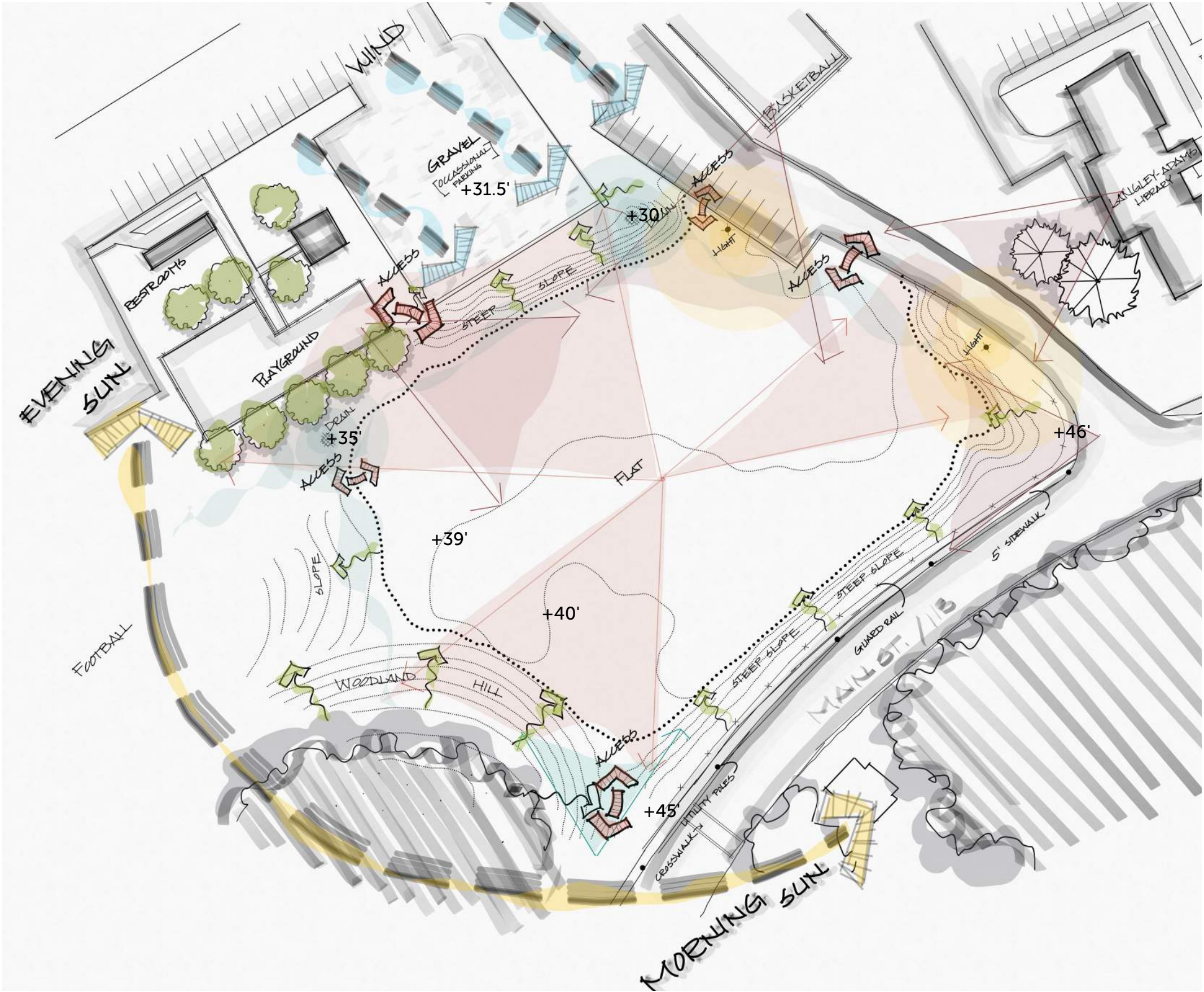

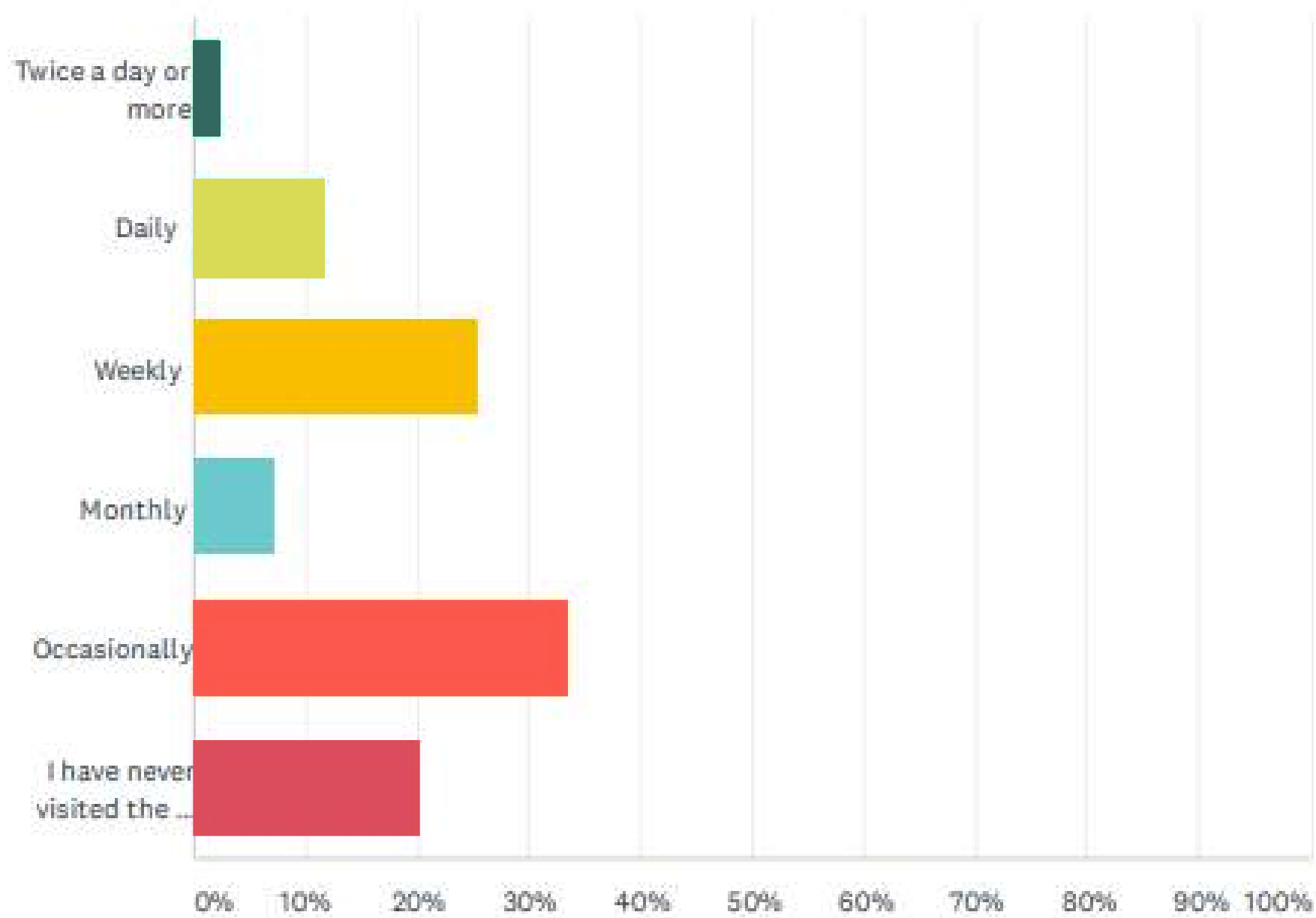
Question: How many dogs do you have?

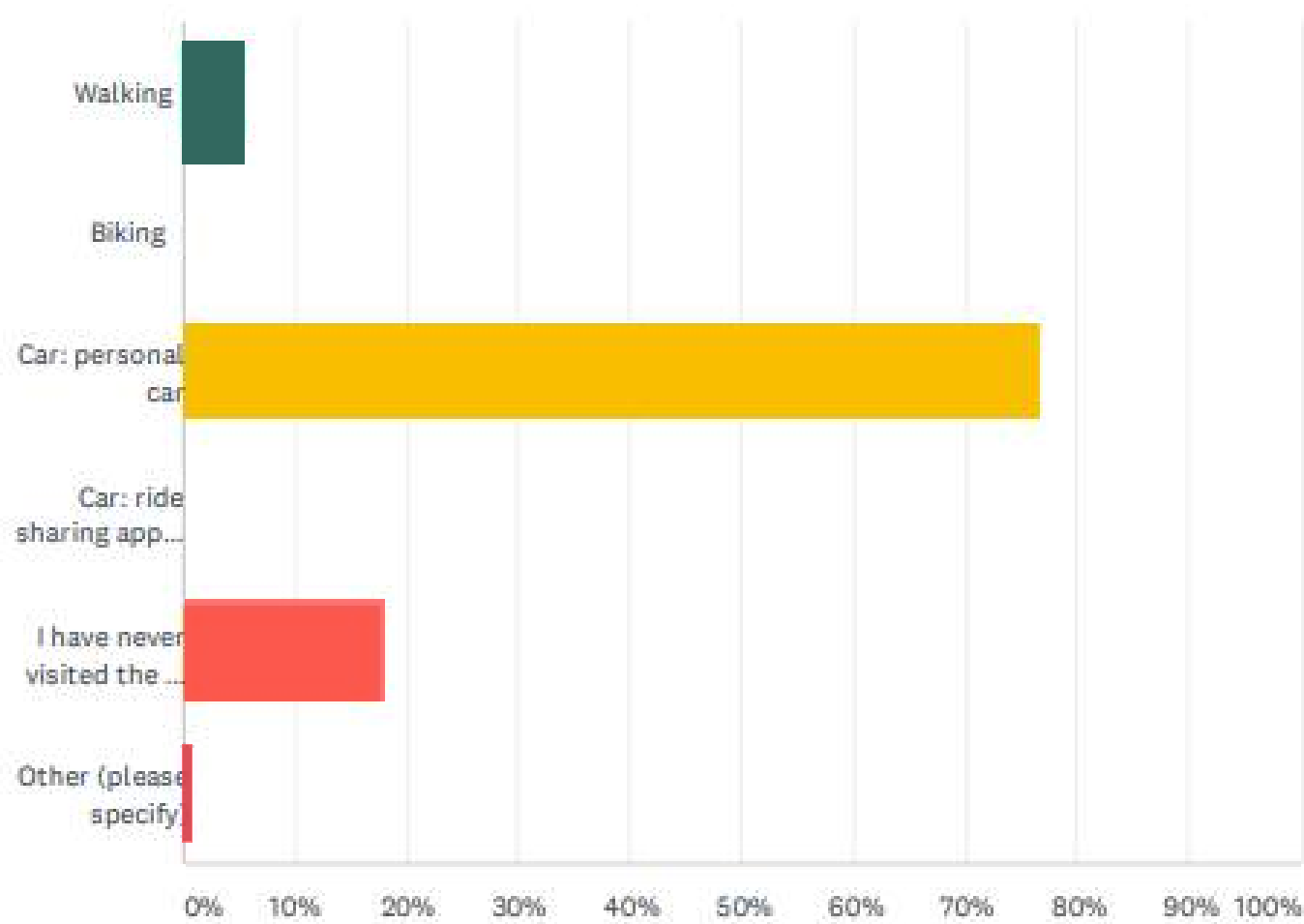

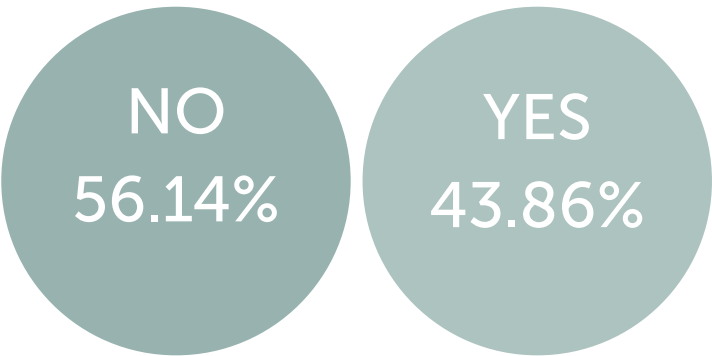

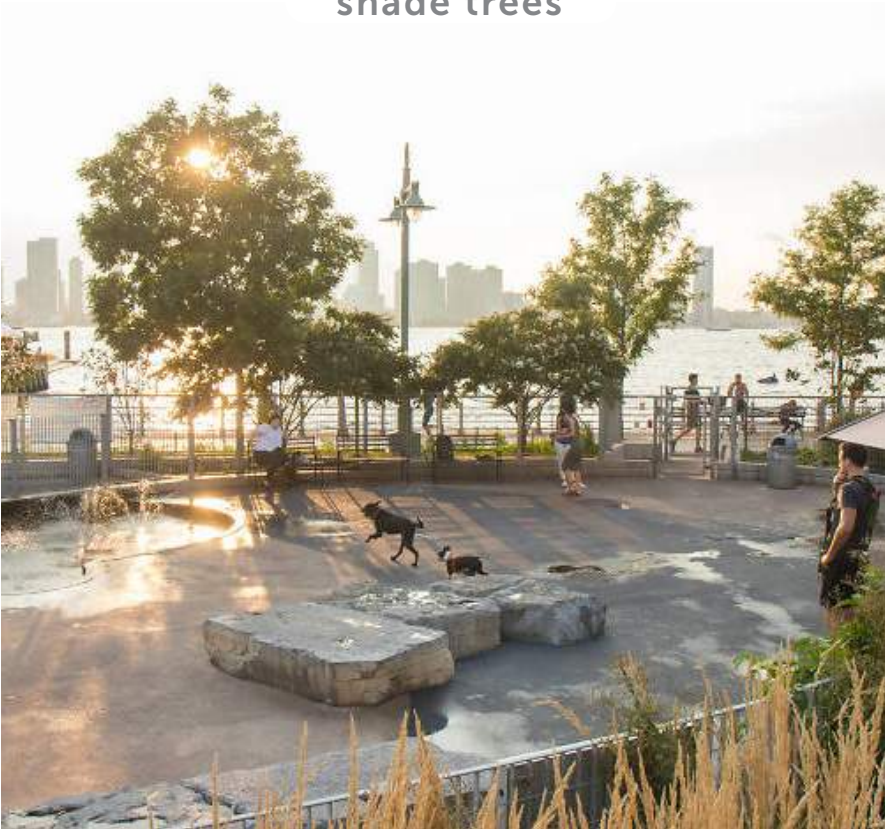

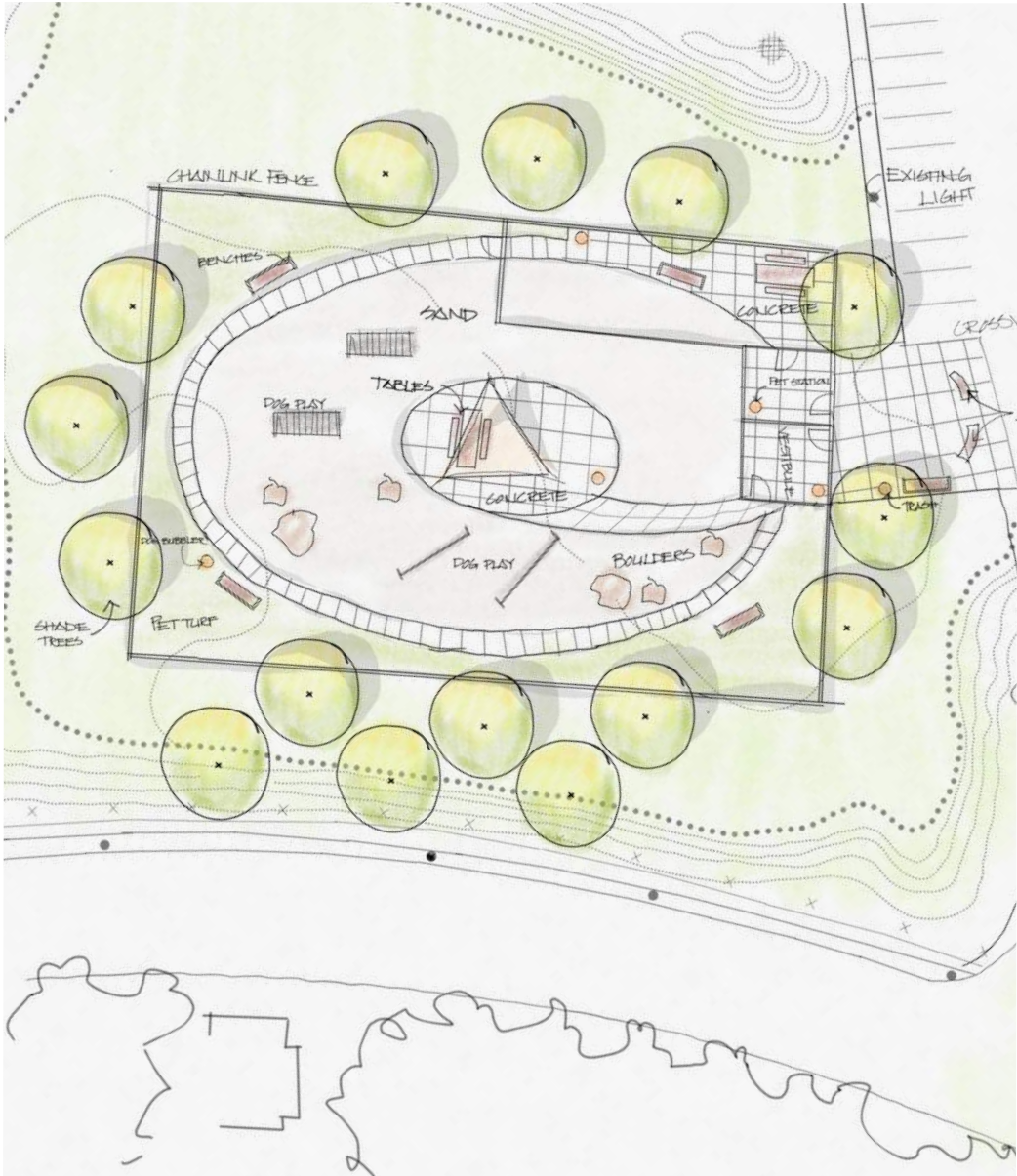

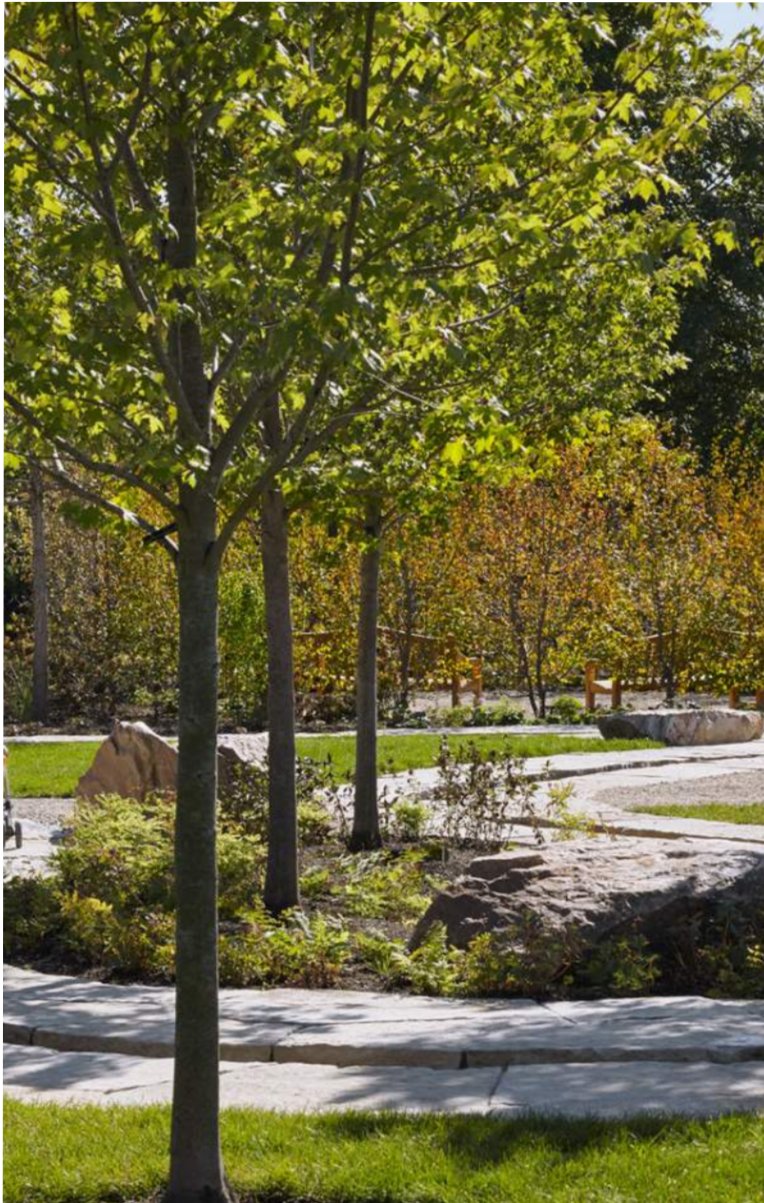

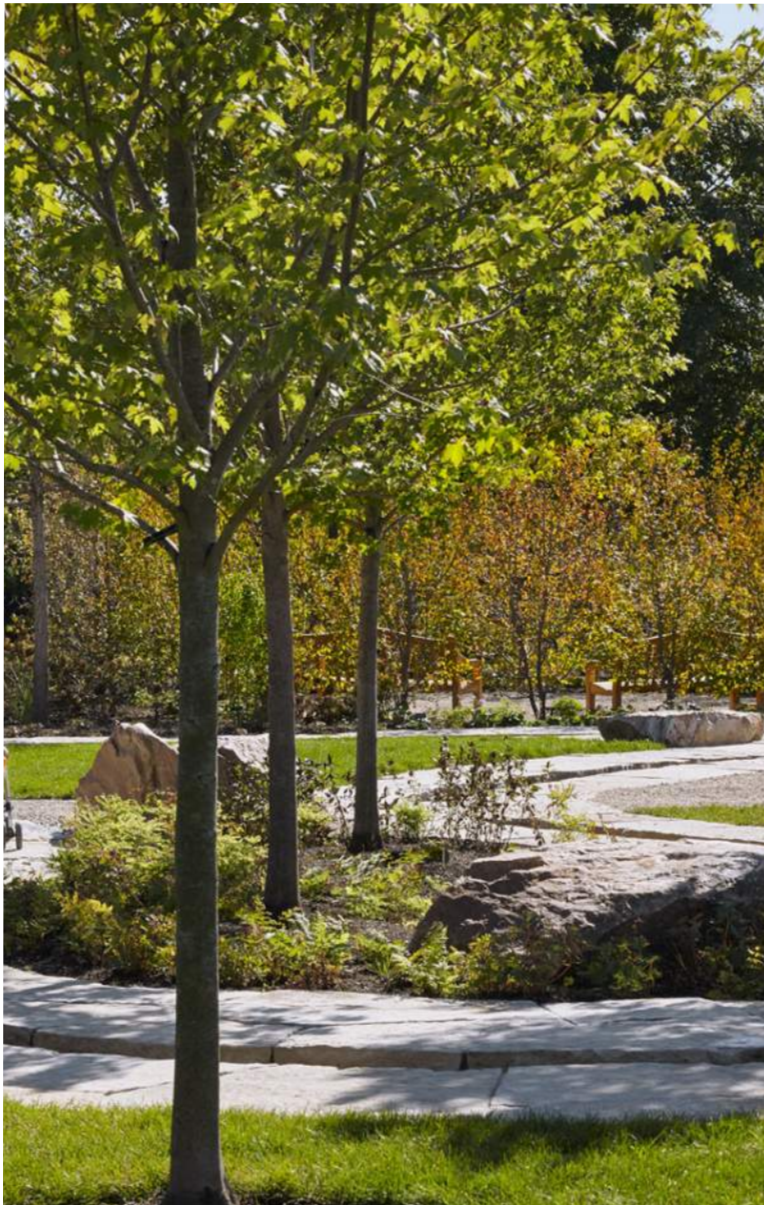
