Water Bill Discount for those 65+

Discount on Water Bill

- Residents aged 65 and older who own and occupy their home are eligible for a 10% discount on the water minimum charge. To qualify, applicants must be 65 or older before the start of the fiscal year. To apply, complete the application form and return it to the Water and Sewer Department at 183 Main Street, Groveland, MA 01834, along with proof of age (such as a photo ID, driver's license, birth certificate, or Medicare card).

YOU ASKED, WE ANSWERED: QUICK TIPS FOR MANAGING JUNK MAIL

It's that time of year when our mailboxes—both USPS and email—fill up with junk! We've received requests to share some tips on how to reduce this influx of unwanted mail. Here you go:

- Get off Commercial US Email Lists (Free): Register at https://www.ims-dm.com/cgi/optoutemps.php to remove your name from commercial email lists.
- Do Not Contact for Caretaker's Registration: Caregivers can register at https://www.ims-dm.com/cgi/dncc.php to limit mail for those they assist.
- Opt-Out of Prescreened Offers: Visit https://www.optoutprescreen.com/ to opt out of receiving prescreened offers for credit and insurance for five years or permanently.
- Choose Your Mail with DMAchoice: Visit https://www.dmachoice.org/ to select which catalogs, magazine offers, and other mail you want to receive. Note that there's a \$4 processing fee, and registration lasts for 10 years.
- Prevent Mail for Deceased Individuals (\$1 Fee): Register for the https://www.ims-dm.com/cgi/ddnc.php to stop mail directed to deceased individuals.



Community Snow Helpers: Groveland's Snow Shoveling Match Program

Need a little help keeping your property shoveled this winter? The Community Snow Helpers program connects individuals aged 14 and older with older adults (60+) and homeowners with disabilities in Groveland for snow shoveling assistance. This matching program pairs individuals who need help with those willing to provide it, ensuring our community members can safely navigate the winter months.

For Older Adults Seeking Shoveling Help:

If you need assistance keeping your property clear of snow, apply for help through the Community Snow Helpers program at the Groveland COA! After each snowfall, you can contact your assigned helper to request services, including:

- Sidewalk & Steps: \$20
- Driveway (1 Spot): \$20 (Note: This is for space for one car to get in and out next to the road, not for long driveways.)
- If the cost is a concern, please note this on your application.

Important Information for Residents Requesting Help:

- You must be a resident of Groveland and aged 60 or older and/or and adult living with a disability.
- Homeowners contact their assigned helper after each snowfall to arrange for shoveling services directly.
- Homeowners will pay helpers directly.
- Snow removal from vehicles remains the homeowner's responsibility.
- Helpers will only use shovels —no snow blowers allowed.

To sign up for snow shoveling help:

 Submit an Application Form and a CORI form to the Groveland Council on Aging at 183 Main Street. Bring a government-issued photo ID, or contact us for assistance if you are homebound. Applications will be available by Nov. 4.

For Helpers (Shovelers):

Are you looking to earn some extra cash this winter? Join the Community Snow Helpers as a shoveler! You'll receive payment for each house you clear after a snowfall. Participants must be 14 years of age or older. If you're interested in providing community service without payment, please indicate that on your application.

Important Information for Helpers:

- All participants must complete a 2024 Application Form, applications will be available by Nov. 4 at the COA office & online.
- Participants aged 18 or older must also submit a CORI form.
- Helpers will attend a brief in-person informational session with the COA Director before being matched.
- Bring your own shovel.
- After each significant snowfall, you will be assigned to one or more homes based on your availability and the needs of the residents requesting assistance.
