UPDATES FROM THE GROVELAND BOARD OF HEALTH

Health Care Proxy Forms Planning ahead for your health care is important. Health Care Proxy forms are available at the Board of Health office in Town Hall. This critical document allows you to designate someone to make medical decisions on your behalf if you are unable to do so.

Safe Disposal of Used Needles Need to dispose of used needles? Bring them to the Board of Health office in a sealed container (such as a coffee can). If you don't have a container, the BOH can provide one. The office is located in Town Hall, just down the hall from the COA.

PROTECTING OUR WATER: UNDERSTANDING STORMWATER & ITS IMPACT

- What is Stormwater? Stormwater is any runoff from rain or snow melt that drains into the Town's drainage systems and ultimately ends up in groundwater, ponds, streams and/or wetland resource areas.
- Why Does Stormwater Matter? As rain or snow melt flows over paved surfaces it carries with it any pollutants such as oils, fertilizer, sand, and trash. The pollutants will eventually enter groundwater, ponds, streams and/or wetland resource areas and will contaminate drinking water supplies, fish and wildlife.


